MINUTES OF HARRISON TOWNSHIP BOARD TRUSTEES REGULAR MEETING

OPENING

The Harrison Township Board of Trustees met in regular session with Chairman, Thomas C. Losekamp, calling the meeting to order. Answering the roll call were: Kenneth W. Fohl, Larry E. Kinnett and Thomas C. Losekamp.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Kinnett made a motion to approve the minutes of the February 21, 2024 regular meeting. Mr. Fohl seconded the motion, roll call – all yea.

FISCAL OFFICER'S REPORT

Mr. Losekamp made a motion to approve the Fiscal Officer's Financial Report, which includes the payment of the bills. Mr. Kinnett seconded the motion, roll call – all yea.

VISITORS

Melissa Heidtmann from the Hamilton County Library gave an update on several activities and events the Harrison Branch is planning this year.

Neena Jud and Matt Kettering from Kettering Corvettes updated the board on a number of changes taking place with the development at 10115 Harrison Avenue. After some discussion Mr. Kettering asked the board to recommend the proposed changes to Hamilton County.

POLICE REPORT

Sgt. Oliver Albert of the Hamilton County Sheriff's office reported that there were several incidents in Harrison Township. There was a criminal damaging report, 3 theft reports, 2 burglary reports and identity fraud report. There was a total of 9 auto crashes. There were 112 calls for service in Harrison Township during this period. Deputies responded to 65 of those calls for service and logged out 47 calls for service due to Be on the Look Of, public services, EMS runs etc. The average response time to responded calls for service was 6 minutes, which is down 3 minutes from last month.

Sgt. Albert responded to concerns brought up last meeting on response time and other related issues. After a complete internal investigation it was determined the complaint was unfounded.

Sgt. Albert announced a drug take back event at the Harrison Township Civic Center on April 27, 2024 from 10AM – 2PM.
